2013-14 Awards:

Meetings:

The committee held three formal meetings throughout the academic year. Fall term the charge and calendar were presented to the committee members, the system of evaluation was discussed, members of admission and financial aid staff were authorized to serve as evaluators of freshmen applications. During the winter term, file reader training was conducted and file distribution discussed. Each committee member was responsible to evaluate up to 90 applications. Applicant files were evaluated based on the following: 1) the student’s academic profile, including quality of coursework, grade point average, test scores and other academic achievements; 2) the faculty letter of recommendation; 3) the student’s level of commitment to extra-curricular activities; 4) quality of written essay. During spring term, the committee met to select 2014-15 Bowerman recipients, choosing ten outstanding senior students, providing awards of \$5160 each. Recommendations were made for the 2015-16 school year scholarship application, evaluation, and process.
